Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with supervisors Bardole, Burkett, Contner and Rudolph present. Absent: Muir. Motion by Contner, second by Bardole to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Bardole, second by Burkett to approve the minutes of September 18, 2017. Motion carried unanimously.

Under communications, auditor Jane Heun reported that the farmer's market has been extended to include the first two Tuesdays in October. A holiday market is also scheduled at the courthouse on November 21st. Supervisor Dawn Rudolph shared a letter from Dick Finch with the rest of the board expressing his unhappiness with how last week's hog hearings turned out.

Supervisors reporting for other meetings attended included Peter Bardole for GCDC's annual meeting, Mick Burkett for a department head meeting, and Dawn Rudolph for Freedom Rock and Heart of Iowa Community Services meetings.

Motion by Contner, second by Burkett to approve claims for payment and auditor signing E911 checks. Motion carried unanimously.

The board discussed a request from the Domestic Abuse Violence Awareness group to color the bell tower with purple lighting on October 2nd. The supervisors had previously denied a request to color the tower and reiterated its policy to keep the illumination of the tower the same as it has been. Assistant county attorney Thomas Laehn said that the board cannot discriminate for groups requesting a lighting color change and should remain consistent in its policy of refusing all requests to do so.

Motion by Contner, second by Burkett to accept the Treasurer's Investment & Driver's License Report for August. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Contner, second by Bardole to approve the FY2018 Governor's Traffic Safety Bureau grant totaling \$3,000. Motion carried unanimously.

Supervisor Rudolph announced a recess from 9:25 a.m. to await the final agenda item. The board returned to regular session at 9:40 a.m.

Presentation of a plaque and years of service certificate for retiring secondary roads employee George Erickson was made with words of appreciation from county engineer Wade Weiss and the supervisors. Motion by Burkett, second by Bardole to approve Resolution 2017-33:

BE IT RESOLVED that the Greene County Board of Supervisors commends George Erickson for his forty-one years of dedicated service to the Secondary Roads department. George's dedication and commitment to Greene County and its citizens is hereby noted and will long be remembered.

Rudolph adjourned the meeting at 10:00 a.m.
