Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with all supervisors present: Bardole, Burkett, Contner, Muir, Rudolph. Motion by Contner, second by Rudolph to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Burkett, second by Contner to approve the minutes of September 4, 2018. Motion carried unanimously.

Supervisors John Muir and Dawn Rudolph reported attending a meeting of the county's insurance committee. Muir and Supervisor Pete Bardole reported meeting with Jefferson's city administrator Mike Palmer to discuss the city's banner policy regarding 4H banners discussed at the last supervisor meeting. The city will allow the banners to be displayed a week before and during the county fair. Supervisor Mick Burkett reported vet affairs commissioner Jerry Spaulding has requested two supervisors be included in the upcoming interviews for a county veteran service officer/director. Burkett also reported that he and Chuck Wenthold had attended the Dana council meeting and discussed the TIF information and agreement that is to be considered by the council in the future. Board representatives plan to discuss TIF at Jefferson, Paton and Grand Junction council meetings scheduled this week.

Assistant county attorney Thomas Laehn reported the courthouse security committee will be meeting before long to discuss the results of the risk assessment performed earlier this year. Recommendations to the board of supervisors are to be made after this meeting. Laehn mentioned moving the magistrate office from the first to the third floor as part of this assessment. He also recommended hiring a part time assistant county attorney after the upcoming election.

Stan and Sandy Gibson and Deb Mohr asked the board to consider putting stop signs at the intersection of 240th Street (old Lincoln Highway) and County Road P14. There are currently stop signs on P14 and it can be difficult to see oncoming traffic on 240th Street. County engineer Wade Weiss noted that his office will investigate what might be done to help in this matter.

Mike Palmer shared one of the city's wayfinding signs and updated the board on the status of city projects and activities.

Motion by Rudolph, second by Burkett to accept the Recorder's Report of Fees for August. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Contner, second by Bardole to approve claims for payment. Motion carried unanimously.

Wade Weiss reported being in the final stage of negotiations with MidAmerican Energy for road damage during the second phase of the Beaver Creek wind turbine construction.

Muir adjourned the meeting at 9:25 a.m.
