Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with all supervisors present: Bardole, Burkett, Contner, Muir, Rudolph. Motion by Bardole, second by Burkett to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Rudolph, second by Contner to approve the minutes of May 20, 2019. Motion carried unanimously.

Supervisor Dawn Rudolph reported that she, supervisor Pete Bardole and county attorney Thomas Laehn had met with members of the Tower View team to further discuss the county's need to set a policy regarding art on the courthouse grounds. Laehn intends to write a policy for consideration by the board of supervisors. Rudolph reported for a CICS mental health region meeting she attended, and Supervisor Mick Burkett reported attending a Pioneer Cemetery meeting. Chuck Wenthold shared a draft outline for the North Raccoon Watershed management plan. Engineer Wade Weiss reported the Tower roof has been completed, but now Tower windows need to be resealed. Peg Raney, program director of Jefferson Matters: Main Street, reported that GCDC's application to earn Iowa Great Places designation has been approved to proceed to the next level which includes a site visit next week.

Motion by Contner, second by Burkett to approve claims for payment and E911 checks signed by auditor. Motion carried unanimously.

The board next reviewed a proposed drainage districts assessment schedule recommended by drainage clerk Michelle Fields. Teleconference calls were made to Carroll, Webster, Guthrie and Calhoun county boards of supervisors for joint approval of drain assessments for DD150-86, 18-35, 104-8 and 8-55, respectively. The resolution for drainage assessments was held for consideration later during the board meeting.

Alan Robinson and Angie Jones of the Grand Junction 150 committee shared plans for Grand Junction's three-day celebration of the town's 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Their application for Dreyfus funding requests \$2,500 from the board. Chair John Muir indicated that the Dreyfus funds have most generally been given for bricks- and-mortar projects. Muir expressed his opinion that the 150-year celebration would be a one-time situation for funding. Motion by Bardole, second by Burkett to approve \$2,500 for the Grand Junction 150 committee. Aye: Bardole, Burkett, Contner, Muir. Nay: Rudolph.

The board next discussed a request from Kirk Citurs to improve surface drainage in DD106. There was discussion on the request with no action taken by the board.

Motion by Contner, second by Rudolph to approve Resolution 2019-21 for drainage assessments:

WHEREAS the Board of Supervisors of Greene County, Iowa, acting as drainage trustees, having investigated the financial condition of Drainage District No. See Schedule, and having

found from said investigation that the funds on hand and available are insufficient to meet the requirements of said District, and

WHEREAS in the judgment of said Board of Supervisors, an assessment of See Schedule % (percent) of the original assessment of benefits in said Districts is necessary to meet the requirements of said Districts, and to pay off outstanding warrants with accrued interest, heretofore issued against said districts.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that an assessment of See Schedule % (percent) of the original assessment of benefits heretofore levied in said Districts be, and the same is hereby levied against all of the lands, lots and parcels of ground in said Districts, that said Districts shall bear interest at the rate of six (6) % per annum from and after thirty (30) days from date of assessment which is set for May 28, 2019 and be payable the same as ordinary taxes.
