Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with all supervisors present: Bardole, Burkett, Contner, Muir, Rudolph. Motion by Contner, second by Bardole to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Rudolph, second by Burkett to approve the minutes of September 3, 2019. Motion carried unanimously.

Supervisor Pete Bardole reported attending a meeting of the GCDC executive committee. Sheriff Jack Williams and county attorney Thomas Laehn addressed questions initiated by supervisor Dawn Rudolph pertaining to the proposed social hosting ordinance.

Mike Palmer provided an update of city of Jefferson projects and activities that included downtown buildings, east entryway and airport extension work.

Motion by Contner, second by Rudolph to appoint Jack Williams and Michele Madsen as Medical Examiner Investigators until 12/31/2020. Motion carried unanimously. Dennis Morlan remains a medical examiner investigator for Greene County.

At 9:00 a.m., the board placed a conference call to Ahlers & Cooney attorneys to discuss the county's process for bond issuance, with proceeds to be used to reimburse up to \$5M to the Greene County Community School District Career Academy construction. Nathan Overberg and Kristin Cooper of Ahlers Cooney and Nathan Summers of D.A. Davidson & Co., the county's municipal advisor, participated in the discussion with the board. Cooper explained the steps to be taken and information necessary in a public hearing notice for the "essential county urban renewal" project. Cooper will send the notification information for newspaper publication to the Auditor's office. The call ended at 9:25 a.m.

Motion by Contner, second by Bardole to approve claims for payment and auditor signing E911 checks. Motion carried unanimously.

Chair Muir adjourned the meeting at 9:35 a.m.
