Proposition D

Shall the following ordinance be adopted?

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 5-1-3 OF THE GRAND JUNCTION CODE OF ORDINANCES 2004, QUALIFICATION OF TRUSTEES.

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, Iowa and the voters thereof, as follows:

SECTION 1: PURPOSE. The purpose of the Ordinance is to amend the Code of Ordinances of the City of Grand Junction, Iowa, 2004 to provide for a change in the qualifications of the members of the library board of trustees.

SECTION 2: AMENDMENT. Title V, Chapter 1, of the Grand Junction Code of Ordinances 2004 shall be amended by striking section 5-1-3 in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof:

5-1-3 QUALIFICATIONS OF TRUSTEES. All of the members of the board shall be over the age of eighteen (18). At least four of the members shall be bona fide citizens and residents of the City. The other members may reside outside the City as long as they reside within the library district.

SECTION 3: SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4: EFFECTIVE DATE: This ordinance shall be effective upon its passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.
